Primary Children's Hospital is a 289-bed medical center and the only Level I Pediatric Trauma Center serving a 400,000 square mile region across six states. It is ranked as one of the nation's best children's hospitals in 8 of 10 specialties in U.S. News & World Report's 2020-21 Best Children's Hospitals Ranking Report and is also ranked among the top 20 most beautiful hospitals in the United States.

The hospital is a full-service Trauma 1 Pediatric Center certified by the American College of Surgeons. As a resident, you'll serve an important role in the Emergency Department

with responsibilities to work alongside healthcare providers from many departments in the treatment of oral infection and dental trauma.

Primary Children's Hospital is located on the beautiful University of Utah Campus, which is home to an extensive network of hospitals, clinics, and graduate schools. A tight-knit program that fosters relationships with a faculty-resident ratio of no more than 1:3.


You'll be a part of the team that prioritizes resident and faculty well-being
